The Collegiate Recovery Community, a program of the Center for Young Adult Addiction and Recovery (CYAAR) at Kennesaw State University, understands the needs of the developing college student in recovery from addiction. By providing recovery support services on campus, students at KSU have a vehicle to support change and prevent relapse. The Collegiate Recovery program offers students in recovery the opportunity for leadership, service and a peer model of support while attaining a college degree. By choosing to be a part of the community, students develop the commitment, principles and ethical responsibility to grow in recovery and academics.

Students who apply to the program:

- work a 12-step program.
- have a sponsor.
- have a minimum of six months of recovery.
- attend academic advising with a CRC advisor.
- schedule their classes around recovery and CRC meetings.

Student participants of the CRC are eligible to apply for scholarships if they meet the program and merit-based criteria outlined in the scholarship.

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DID YOU KNOW?

Among full time college students, **59.4%** were current drinkers, **39.0%** were binge drinkers, and **12.7%** were heavy drinkers. (SAMSHA 2014)
